We have audited the accompanying Financial Statements of Satya Townships Private Limited ("the Company"), which comprise the Balance Sheet as at March 31, 2019, the Statement of Profit and Loss and the Statement of Cash Flows for the year ended on that date, and a summary of the significant accounting policies and other explanatory information (hereinafter referred to as "the Financial Statements"). In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the В. explanations given to us, the aforesaid Financial Statements give the information required by the Companies Act, 2013 ("the Act") in the manner so required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the Accounting Standards prescribed under section 133 of the Act read with the Companies (Accounting Standards) Rules, 2006, as amended, ("AS") and other accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the state of affairs of the Company as at March 31, 2019, the loss and its cash flows for the year ended on that date. **Basis for Opinion** We conducted our audit of the Financial Statements in accordance with the Standards on Auditing specified under section 143(10) of the Act (SAs), Our responsibilities under those Standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are independent of the Company in accordance with the Code of Ethics issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India(ICAI) together with the independence requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial statements under the provisions of the Act and the Rules made there under, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the ICAI's Code of Ethics, We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion on the Financial Statements. 3. Other Information - Board of Directors' Report The Company's Board of Directors is responsible for the preparation and presentation of its report (hegein after called as "Board Report") which comprises various information required under section 134(3) of the Companies Act 2013 but does not include the financial statements and our auditor's report thereon. Our opinion on the financial statements does not cover the Board Report and we do not express any\form of assurance conclusion

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B. Notes to the financial statements for the year ended March 31, 2019

1. Corporate information

Satya Township Private Limited is a Private Limited Company incorporated under the provisions of the Companies Act, 1956. The company is primarily engaged in the business of promotion, construction and development of integrated townships, residential & commercial complex, multistoried buildings, flats, houses, apartments, shopping malls, IT Parks, Hotels, etc.

2. Basis of preparation

• The financial statements of the company have been prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles in India (Indian GAAP).

• The company has prepared these financial statements to comply in all material respects with the accounting standards notified under the Companies (Accounting Standards) Rules, 2006, (as amended) and the relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 1956.

 The company follows the Mercantile System of Accounting recognizing Income and Expenditure on accrual basis.

• The directors have certified that there are no outstanding expenses not provided for and nor there are income which have fallen due but not accounted for. The accounts are prepared on historical cost basis and as a going concern.

The accounting policies adopted in the preparation of financial statements are consistent withthose of previous year.

3. Summary of significant accounting policies

From the year ended 31 March 2014, Schedule III notified under the Companies Act 2013, hasbecome applicable to the company, for preparation and presentation of its financial statements. The adoption of Schedule III does notimpact recognition and measurement principles followed for preparation of financial statements. However, ithas significant impact on presentation and disclosures made in the financial statements. The company has also reclassified the previous year figures in accordance with the requirements applicable in the current year.

Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with Indian GAAP requires the management to makejudgments, estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of revenues, expenses, assets andliabilities and the disclosure of contingent liabilities, at the end of the reporting period. Although these estimates are based on the management's best knowledge of current events and actions, uncertainty about these assumptions and estimates could result in the outcomes requiring a material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets or liabilities in future periods.

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Cost of Construction/Development

Cost of Construction/ Development incurred is charged to the Profit and Loss Account proportionate to Project Area Sold. Adjustments, if required, are made on completion of the respective projects.

Cost of Construction/ Development of a Project includes direct costs and indirect costs apportioned to the Projects in the ration of direct costs incurred during the year.

Valuation of Inventories

Inventory comprises completed property for sale and property under construction (work in progress).

- Completed unsold inventory is valued at lower of cost or net realizable value. Cost is determined by including cost of land, materials, services and other related overheads.
- Work-in-progress is valued at cost, which comprises cost of land, materials, services and other related overheads related to projects under construction.

Investments

Long-term Investments have been stated at costs net of diminution in the value of investments to the extent it represents, in the opinion of the management, a permanent impairment in the values.

Revenue Recognition

- Sale is considered according to percentage of completion method in case of projects in which at least 25% of total estimated project cost has been incurred at the end of the financial year or at least 25% of the Sale proceeds are received.
- o Sale of Constructed properties is recognized on the percentage of completion method. Total Sale Consideration as per agreement to sell in respect of constructed properties entered into is recognized as revenue based on the percentage of actual project costs incurred thereon to total estimated project cost, subject to such actual cost incurred being cost of such properties. The estimates of the saleable area and costs are reviewed periodically and effect of any changes in such estimates is recognized in the period such changes are determined. However, when the total project cost is estimated to exceed total revenues from the project, the loss is recognized immediately
- o Interest on late payments is recognized on receipt basis, being such income contingent in nature

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Fixed Assets

Fixed Assets are stated at cost. Depreciation of fixed assets is calculated on the basis of useful life prescribed under Schedule II to the companies Act, 2013.

Retirement Benefits

The company has not made provisions for Gratuity, as Management represents that there are no employees who have completed more than five years with the Company.

Foreign Currency Transactions

Transactions in foreign currencies are recorded at the exchange rate prevailing on the date of the transactions.

Taxation

- Tax expense comprises current and deferred tax. Current income-tax is measured at the amount expected to be paid to the tax authorities in accordance with the Income-tax Act, 1961 enacted in India and tax laws prevailing in the respective tax jurisdictions where the company operates. The tax rates and tax laws used to compute the amount are those that are enacted or substantively enacted, at the reporting date.
- Deferred income taxes reflect the impact of timing differences between taxable income and accounting income originating during the current year and reversal of timing differences for the earlier years.
