

INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

TO THE MEMBERS OF SILVERGLADES INFRASTRUCTURE PRIVATE LIMITED

Report on the Financial Statements

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of SILVERGLADES INFRASTRUCTURE PVT LTD ("the company"), which comprise the Balance Sheet as at 31 March 2017, the Statement of Profit and Loss, the Cash Flow Statement for the year then ended, and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

The Company's Board of Directors is responsible for the matters stated in section 134(5) of the Companies Act, 2013 ("the Act") with respect to the preparation and presentation of these financial statements that give a true and fair view of the financial position, financial performance and cash flows of the Company in accordance with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, including the Accounting Standards specified under Section 133 of the Act, read with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014. This responsibility also includes the maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provision of the Act for safeguarding of the assets of the Company and for preventing and detecting the frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial control, that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the financial statements that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

We have taken into account the provisions of the Act, the accounting and auditing standards and matters which are required to be included in the audit report under the provisions of the Act and the Rules made thereunder.

We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing specified under section 143(10) of the Act. Those Standards require that we comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. E: SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1 BASIS OF PRESENTATION: The financial statements have been prepared in complaince in all material aspects with the Accounting Standards Rules, 2006 and the relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 2013. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention on an accurate bases and on the basis of going concern.

2 FIXED ASSETS AND DEPRECIATION

- i) Fixed Assets are stated at Cost of Aequisition
- ii) Depreciation on Fixed Assets upto 31.03.2014 is provided on the written down value method (prorated on additions/deletions during year) at rates prescribed in schedule IV of the Companies Act 1956. Assets costing less than Rs 5,000/- are fully depreciated in the year of purchase. Depreciation is provided on written down method by depreciating carrying amount of fixed assets as on 01.04.2014 over remaining useful life of the assets as per schedule If of the Companies Act 2013.

3 Revenue recognition

- i) A) The Company follows "percentage of completion method" of accounting for contracts and constructed residential, institutional and commercial properties. As per this method, the revenue is recognized in proportion to the actual costs incurred as against the total estimated cost of the projects under execution subject to actual cost being 30% or more of the total estimated cost. Effective [April 2012, in accordance with the "Guidance Note on Accounting for Real Estate Transactions (Revised 2012)" (Guidance note) all projects commercing on or after the said date or projects where revenue is recognized for the first time on after the above date, construction revenue on such projects have been recognized on percentage of completion method provided the following thresholds have
- (a) All critical approvals necessary for the project commencement have been obtained
- (b) The expenditure incurred on construction and development cost (excluding land costs) is not less than 25% of the total estimated construction and development costs.
- (c) At least 25% of the saleable project area is secured by agreements with buyers, and
- (d) At least 10% of the sale proceeds relating to agreements secured are realized at the reporting date in respect of such contracts.
- B) The estimates related to saleable area, sale value, estimated costs etc. are revised and updated periodically by the management and necessary adjustments are made in the accounts in the year in which the estimates are revised.
- ii) Whereas all income and expenses are accounted for on accrual basis, interest on delayed payments by customers against dues is taken into account on ac
- iii) Indirect costs (as detailed in the Statement of Profit & Loss) are treated as "Period Costs" and are charged to the Statement of Profit & Loss in the year incurred.

- The company has not earned any income and has not incurred any expenditure (Previous year USD 5,000 in INR 3,01,500) in foreign currency.
- 2. Auditors remuneration of Rs. 74,750/- (inclusive of taxes) is on account of Audit Fees only (previous year Rs 74,100/- inclusive of service tax).
- 3. Pursuant to term loan facilities aggregating to Rs. 130 crores extended by IL&FS Financial Services Limited("IFIN") to Emerald Lands (India) Private Limited ("Borrower") in February 2016, the Company had pledged 1,27,500 Class A Equity Shares and 42,36,457 Class C Equity Shares held in Emerald Lands (India) Private Limited in favour of IL&FS Trust Company Limited, acting as security trustee for the benefit of IFIN ("Security Trustee") to secure the dues of the Borrower vide pledge agreement dated 6th June 2016. Pursuant to a further term loan facility aggregating to Rs. 20 crores extended by IFIN to the Borrower in September 2017, the Company has pledged a further 1,22,450 Class C Equity Shares held in Emerald Lands (India) Private Limited in favour of the Security Trustee to secure the dues of the Borrower vide pledge agreement dated 12th September, 2017...
- 4. The Company has entered into an MOU / Agreement on 04.02.2006 with Qutab Properties Pvt Ltd, and others for acquisition of land at Village Sehsola ,Tehsil Tauaru, Distt Mewat (Nuh) for execution of a real estate project. The company has already paid to Rs.9.85 Lac against MOU/Agreement. The Company has initiated the recovery of the advances and considers the advances as good.
- 5. The Company filed an appeal in the court of the District Judge, Mewat (Nuh) against the judgment and decree dated 19.07.2013 passed by the court of the Civil Judge on the petition filed by the Company for specific performance by parties for execution of sale deed in favour of the Company in village Nanuka, Tehsil Tauru, Dist Mewat (Nuh) ,which was dismissed on 06.11.2013 .Now appeal is pending in High Court , Chandigarh . The management considers the advance of Rs.1,68,000.00 as good.
- 6. The Company obtained decree for possession by way of specific performance of contract directing a party in village Nanuka, Tehsil Tauru, Distt. Mewat (Nuh), to perform his part of the contract and execute sale deed in favour of the Company after receiving payment of balance consideration. The Company had accordingly deposited a sum of Rs.8,33,630/- with the Hon'ble Court. The Company had thereafter filed an execution petition in the court of the Civil Judge (Senior Division) Nuh, to get the parties to have the sale deed executed and registered in favour of the Company and delivery of possession of the land to the Company and if required have the same done through a court commission. An appeal was filed by some affected parties in the District Court for setting aside the judgment and decree which has been dismissed in favour of the Company. Execution proceedings are pending in court.

- 7. The Company had entered into two collaboration agreements with M/s Magnitude Properties Pvt. Ltd. (MPPL) on 24.06.2011 for development of two commercial projects in Sector-88, Gurgaon. The Company has, pursuant to one of the collaboration agreements obtained from the Town and Country Planning Department, Haryana, a License dated 07-01-2013 under the Haryana Development and Regulation of Urban Areas Act, 1975 & the Rules 1976 made there under, for setting up a commercial colony on land measuring 2.75625 acres in the revenue estate of village Hyatpur, Sector 88, Gurgaon. All expenses incurred pertaining to the setting up of the Commercial Colony under this License have been shown as Work in Progress together with the sum paid to MPPL as non-refundable security and expenses incurred for registration etc. of the second collaboration agreement.
- 8. The Company has entered into a collaboration agreement dated 03-04-2013 with certain individuals for the development of a Group Housing Colony over 4.85 acres (approx) land owned by them in the revenue estate of Village Sukhrali, Sector 28, District Gurgaon, Haryana. The Company has, pursuant to this collaboration agreement obtained from the Directorate of Town & Country Planning, Haryana, a License No. 110 dated 27-12-2013 under the Haryana Development and Regulation of Urban Areas Act, 1975 & the Rules 1976 made there under, for setting up the Group Housing Colony on this land. All expenses incurred pertaining to the setting up of the Group Housing Colony under this License have been shown as Work in Progress together with the non refundable amount paid to the land owners pursuant to the terms of the collaboration agreement.

1: SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Α **NATURE OF OPERATIONS:**

The Company's main business is real estate promotion and development in residential and commercial segment

В **BASIS OF PRESENTATION:**

The Financial Statement of the company has been prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles in India. The company has prepared these financial statements to comply with the Accounting Standards specified under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013, read with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014, to the extent applicable, as adopted consistently by the Company. The Financial Statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, on the basis of going concern and on an accrual basis except as stated otherwise.

C **USE OF ESTIMATES:**

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the results of operations during the reporting period. Although these estimates are based upon management's best knowledge of current events and actions, actual results could differ from these estimates. Difference between the actual results and estimates are recognized in the period in which the results are known / materialized.

D FIXED ASSETS AND DEPRECIATION

- i) Fixed Assets are stated at Cost of Acquisition.
- Depreciation on Fixed Assets upto 31.03.2014 is provided on the written down value method (prorated on ii) additions/deletions during year) at rates prescribed in schedule IV of the Companies Act 1956., Depreciation is provided on written down method by depreciating carrying amount of fixed assets as on 01.04.2014 over remaining useful life of the assets as per schedule II of the Companies Act 2013.

REVENUE RECOGNITION Ε

A) The Company follows "percentage of completion method" of accounting for contracts and constructed i) residential, institutional and commercial properties. As per this method, the revenue is recognized in proportion to the actual costs incurred as against the total estimated cost of the projects under execution subject to actual cost being 30% or more of the total estimated cost.

Effective 1 April 2012, in accordance with the "Guidance Note on Accounting for Real Estate Transactions (Revised 2012)" (Guidance note) all projects commencing on or after the said date or projects where revenue is recognized for the first time on after the above date, construction revenue on such projects have been recognized on percentage of completion method provided the following thresholds have been met in addition to the existing conditions.

- (a) All critical approvals necessary for the project commencement have been obtained.
- (b) The expenditure incurred on construction and development cost (excluding land costs)
- (c) At least 25% of the saleable project area is secured by agreements with buyers; and
- (d) At least 10% of the sale proceeds relating to agreements secured are realized at the reporting date In respect of such contract

B) The estimates related to saleable area, sale value, estimated costs etc. are revised and updated periodically by the management and necessary adjustments are made in the accounts in the year in which the estimates are revised.

F TAXES ON INCOME:

Income tax expense is accounted for in accordance with AS-22, "Accounting for Taxes on Income", as stated below:

- i. Provision for current tax is made based on taxable income for the year computed in accordance with provisions of the Income Tax Act, 1961
- ii. Deferred tax is recognized, subject to the consideration of prudence, on timing differences, being the difference between taxable income and accounting income that originate in one period and are capable of reversal in one or more subsequent periods
- iii. Deferred tax is measured based on the tax rates and the tax laws enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date. Deferred tax assets and deferred tax liabilities are offset, if a legally enforceable right exists to set off current tax assets against current tax liabilities and the deferred tax assets and deferred tax liabilities relate to the taxes on income levied by same governing taxation laws.
- iv. Deferred tax asset is recognized and carried forward to the extent that there is a reasonable certainty of realization. In the case of unabsorbed depreciation and carry forward tax losses deferred tax asset is recognized, to the extent there is virtual certainty that sufficient future taxable income will be available against which such deferred tax assets can be realized.

G EARNINGS PER SHARE:

Basic earning per share is calculated by dividing the net profit or loss for the period attributable to equity shareholders by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the period. For the purpose of calculating diluted earning per share, the net profit or loss for the period attributable to equity shareholders and the weighted average number of shares outstanding during the period are adjusted for the effects of all potential dilutive equity shares.

"PROVISIONS, CONTINGENT LIABILITIES AND CONTINGENT ASSETS:

A provision is recognized when an enterprise has a present obligation as a result of past event and it is probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation, in respect of which a reliable estimate can be made. Provisions are not discounted to its present value and are determined based on best estimate required to settle the obligation at the balance sheet date. These are reviewed at each balance sheet date and adjusted to reflect the current best estimates.

Contingent liabilities are shown by way of note in the Notes to Accounts in respect of obligations where based on the evidence available, their existence at the balance sheet date is considered not probable. Contingent assets are neither recognized in the accounts nor disclosed."

- 1. The company has not earned any income and has not incurred expenditure of RS 7,09,478 i.e (7,000Euros, 2,000 Pounds, 15000 baht) (Previous year NIL)
- 2. Auditors remuneration of Rs. 74,750/- (inclusive of taxes) is on account of Audit Fees only (previous year Rs 74,750/- inclusive of taxes).
- 3. Pursuant to term loan facilities aggregating to Rs. 130 crores extended by IL&FS Financial Services Limited("IFIN") to Emerald Lands (India) Private Limited ("Borrower") in February 2016, the Company had pledged 1,27,500 Class A Equity Shares and 42,36,457 Class C Equity Shares held in Emerald Lands (India) Private Limited in favour of IL&FS Trust Company Limited, acting as security trustee for the benefit of IFIN ("Security Trustee") to secure the dues of the Borrower vide pledge agreement dated 6th June 2016. Pursuant to a further term loan facility aggregating to Rs. 20 crores extended by IFIN to the Borrower in September 2017, the Company has pledged a further 1,22,450 Class C Equity Shares held in Emerald Lands (India) Private Limited in favour of the Security Trustee to secure the dues of the Borrower vide pledge agreement dated 12th September, 2017..
- 4. The Company has entered into an MOU / Agreement on 04.02.2006 with Qutab Properties Pvt Ltd, and others for acquisition of land at Village Sehsola ,Tehsil Tauaru, Distt Mewat (Nuh) for execution of a real estate project. The company has already paid to Rs.9.85 Lac against MOU/Agreement. The Company has initiated the recovery of the advances and considers the advances as good.
- 5. The Company filed an appeal in the court of the District Judge, Mewat (Nuh) against the judgment and decree dated 19.07.2013 passed by the court of the Civil Judge on the petition filed by the Company for specific performance by parties for execution of sale deed in favour of the Company in village Nanuka, Tehsil Tauru, Dist Mewat (Nuh) ,which was dismissed on 06.11.2013 .Now appeal is pending in High Court, Chandigarh. The management considers the advance of Rs.1,68,000.00 as good.
- 6. The Company obtained decree for possession by way of specific performance of contract directing a party in village Nanuka, Tehsil Tauru, Distt. Mewat (Nuh), to perform his part of the contract and execute sale deed in favour of the Company after receiving payment of balance consideration. The Company had accordingly deposited a sum of Rs.8,33,630/- with the Hon'ble Court. The Company had thereafter filed an execution petition in the court of the Civil Judge (Senior Division) Nuh, to get the parties to have the sale deed executed and registered in favour of the Company and delivery of possession of the land to the Company and if required have the same done through a court commission. An appeal was filed by some affected parties in the District Court for setting aside the judgment and decree which has been dismissed in favour of the Company. Execution proceedings are pending in court.
- 7. The Company had entered into two collaboration agreements with M/s Magnitude Properties Pvt. Ltd. (MPPL) on 24.06.2011 for development of two commercial projects in Sector-88, Gurgaon. The Company has, pursuant to one of the collaboration agreements obtained from the Town and Country Planning Department, Haryana, a License dated 07-01-2013 under the Haryana Development and Regulation of Urban Areas Act, 1975 & the Rules 1976 made there under, for setting up a commercial colony on land measuring 2.75625 acres in the revenue estate of village Hyatpur, Sector 88, Gurgaon. All expenses incurred pertaining to the setting up of the Commercial Colony under this License have been shown as Work in Progress together with the sum paid to MPPL as non-refundable security and expenses incurred for registration etc. of the second collaboration agreement.
- 8. The Company has entered into a collaboration agreement dated 03-04-2013 with certain individuals for the development of a Group Housing Colony over 4.85 acres (approx) land owned by them in the revenue estate of Village Sukhrali, Sector 28, District Gurgaon, Haryana. The Company has, pursuant to this collaboration agreement obtained from the Directorate of Town & Country Planning, Haryana, a License No. 110 dated 27-12-13 under the Haryana Development and Regulation of Urban Areas Act, 1975 & the Rules 1976 made there ander, for setting up the Group Housing Colony on this land. All expenses incurred pertaining to the setting in the Group Housing Colony under this License have been shown as Work in Progress together with the non return daily amount paid to the land owners pursuant to the terms of the collaboration agreement.

1: SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

A NATURE OF OPERATIONS:

The Company's main business is real estate promotion and development in residential and commercial segment

B BASIS OF PRESENTATION:

The Financial Statement of the company has been prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles in India. The company has prepared these financial statements to comply with the Accounting Standards specified under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013, read with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014, to the extent applicable, as adopted consistently by the Company. The Financial Statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, on the basis of going concern and on an accrual basis except as stated otherwise.

C USE OF ESTIMATES:

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the results of operations during the reporting period. Although these estimates are based upon management's best knowledge of current events and actions, actual results could differ from these estimates. Difference between the actual results and estimates are recognized in the period in which the results are known / materialized.

D FIXED ASSETS AND DEPRECIATION

- i) Fixed Assets are stated at Cost of Acquisition.
- Depreciation on Fixed Assets upto 31.03.2014 is provided on the written down value method (prorated on additions/deletions during year) at rates prescribed in schedule IV of the Companies Act 1956. Depreciation is provided on written down method by depreciating carrying amount of fixed assets as on 01.04.2014 over remaining useful life of the assets as per schedule II of the Companies Act 2013.

E REVENUE RECOGNITION

i) A) The Company follows "percentage of completion method" of accounting for contracts and constructed residential, institutional and commercial properties. As per this method, the revenue is recognized in proportion to the actual costs incurred as against the total estimated cost of the projects under execution subject to actual cost being 30% or more of the total estimated cost.

Effective 1 April 2012, in accordance with the "Guidance Note on Accounting for Real Estate Transactions (Revised 2012)" (Guidance note) all projects commencing on or after the said date or projects where revenue is recognized for the first time on after the above date, construction revenue on such projects have been recognized on percentage of completion method provided the following thresholds have been met in addition to the existing conditions.

- (a) All critical approvals necessary for the project commencement have been obtained.
- (b) The expenditure incurred on construction and development cost (excluding land costs/development right) is more than 25% of the total estimated expenditure on construction & Development
- (c) At least 25% of the saleable project area is secured by agreements with buyers; and
- (d) At least 10% of the sale proceeds relating to agreements secured are realized at the reporting date. In respect of such contract
- B) The estimates related to saleable area, sale value, estimated costs etc. are revised and updated periodically by the management and necessary adjustments are made in the accounts in the year in which the estimates are revised.
- Whereas all income and expenses are accounted for on accrual basis, interest on delayed payments by customers against dues is taken into account on acceptance or realization owing to practical difficulties and uncertainties involved

Indirect costs (as detailed in the Statement of Profit & Loss) are treated as "Period Costs" and are charged to the Statement of Profit & Loss in the year incurred.



F TAXES ON INCOME:

Income tax expense is accounted for in accordance with AS-22, "Accounting for Taxes on Income", as stated below:

- i. Provision for current tax is made based on taxable income for the year computed in accordance with provisions of the Income Tax Act, 1961
- ii. Deferred tax is recognized, subject to the consideration of prudence, on timing differences, being the difference between taxable income and accounting income that originate in one period and are capable of reversal in one or more subsequent periods
- iii. Deferred tax is measured based on the tax rates and the tax laws enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date. Deferred tax assets and deferred tax liabilities are offset, if a legally enforceable right exists to set off current tax assets against current tax liabilities and the deferred tax assets and deferred tax liabilities relate to the taxes on income levied by same governing taxation laws.
- iv. Deferred tax asset is recognized and carried forward to the extent that there is a reasonable certainty of realization. In the case of unabsorbed depreciation and carry forward tax losses deferred tax asset is recognized, to the extent there is virtual certainty that sufficient future taxable income will be available against which such deferred tax assets can be realized.

G EARNINGS PER SHARE:

Basic earning per share is calculated by dividing the net profit or loss for the period attributable to equity shareholders by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the period. For the purpose of calculating diluted earning per share, the net profit or loss for the period attributable to equity shareholders and the weighted average number of shares outstanding during the period are adjusted for the effects of all potential dilutive equity shares.

"PROVISIONS, CONTINGENT LIABILITIES AND CONTINGENT ASSETS:

A provision is recognized when an enterprise has a present obligation as a result of past event and it is probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation, in respect of which a reliable estimate can be made. Provisions are not discounted to its present value and are determined based on best estimate required to settle the obligation at the balance sheet date. These are reviewed at each balance sheet date and adjusted to reflect the current best estimates.

Contingent liabilities are shown by way of note in the Notes to Accounts in respect of obligations where based on the evidence available, their existence at the balance sheet date is considered not probable. Contingent assets are neither recognized in the accounts nor disclosed."

23- NOTES TO ACCOUNTS

- 1. The company has not earned any income and has not incurred any expenditure in foreign currency (Previous year RS 7,09,478 i.e 7,000Euros, 2,000 Pounds, 15000 baht)
- 2. Auditors remuneration of Rs. 74,750/- (inclusive of taxes) is on account of Audit Fees only (previous year Rs 74,750/- inclusive of taxes).
- 3. Pursuant to term loan facilities aggregating to Rs. 130 crores extended by IL&FS Financial Services Limited("IFIN") to Emerald Lands (India) Private Limited ("Borrower") in February 2016, the Company had pledged 1,27,500 Class A Equity Shares and 42,36,457 Class C Equity Shares held in Emerald Lands (India) Private Limited in favour of IL&FS Trust Company Limited, acting as security trustee for the benefit of IFIN ("Security Trustee") to secure the dues of the Borrower vide pledge agreement dated 6th June 2016. Pursuant to a further term loan facility aggregating to Rs. 20 crores extended by IFIN to the Borrower in September 2017, the Company has pledged a further 1,22,450 Class C Equity Shares held in Emerald Lands (India) Private Limited in favour of the Security Trustee to secure the dues of the Borrower vide pledge agreement dated 12th September, 2017..
- 4. The Company has entered into an MOU / Agreement on 04.02.2006 with Qutab Properties Pvt Ltd, and others for acquisition of land at Village Sehsola ,Tehsil Tauaru, Distt Mewat (Nuh) for execution of a real estate project. The company has already paid to Rs.9.85 Lac against MOU/Agreement. The Company has initiated the recovery of the advances and considers the advances as good.
- 5. The Company filed an appeal in the court of the District Judge, Mewat (Nuh) against the judgment and decree dated 19.07.2013 passed by the court of the Civil Judge on the petition filed by the Company for specific performance by parties for execution of sale deed in favour of the Company in village Nanuka, Tehsil Tauru, Dist Mewat (Nuh) ,which was dismissed on 06.11.2013 .Now appeal is pending in High Court, Chandigarh. The management considers the advance of Rs.1,68,000.00 as good.
- 6. The Company obtained decree for possession by way of specific performance of contract directing a party in village Nanuka, Tehsil Tauru, Distt. Mewat (Nuh), to perform his part of the contract and execute sale deed in favour of the Company after receiving payment of balance consideration. The Company had accordingly deposited a sum of Rs.8,33,630/- with the Hon'ble Court. The Company had thereafter filed an execution petition in the court of the Civil Judge (Senior Division) Nuh, to get the parties to have the sale deed executed and registered in favour of the Company and delivery of possession of the land to the Company and if required have the same done through a court commission. An appeal was filed by some affected parties in the District Court for setting aside the judgment and decree which has been dismissed in favour of the Company. Execution proceedings are pending in court.
- 7. The Company had entered into two collaboration agreements with M/s Magnitude Properties Pvt. Ltd. (MPPL) on 24.06.2011 for development of two commercial projects in Sector-88, Gurgaon. The Company has, pursuant to one of the collaboration agreements obtained from the Town and Country Planning Department, Haryana, a License dated 07-01-2013 under the Haryana Development and Regulation of Urban Areas Act, 1975 & the Rules 1976 made there under, for setting up a commercial colony on land measuring 2.75625 acres in the revenue estate of village Hyatpur, Sector 88, Gurgaon. All expenses incurred pertaining to the setting up of the Commercial Colony under this License have been shown as Work in Progress together with the sum paid to MPPL as non-refundable security and expenses incurred for registration etc. of the second collaboration agreement.
- 8. The Company has entered into a collaboration agreement dated 03-04-2013 with certain individuals for the development of a Group Housing Colony over 4.85 acres (approx) land owned by them in the revenue estate of Village Sukhrali, Sector 28, District Gurgaon, Haryana. The Company has, pursuant to this collaboration agreement obtained from the Directorate of Town & Country Planning, Haryana, a License No. 110 dated 27-12-2013 under the Haryana Development and Regulation of Urban Areas Act, 1975 & the Rules 1976 made there under, for setting up the Group Housing Colony on this land. All expenses incurred pertaining to the setting of the Group Housing Colony under this License have been shown as Work in Progress together with the non refundable amount paid to the land owners pursuant to the terms of the collaboration agreement.
