### Report on the audit of the Standalone Financial Statements

#### **Opinion**

We have audited the accompanying Standalone financial statements of M/s Express Projects Private Limited ("the Company") which comprises the Balance Sheet as at March 31, 2020 and the Statement of Profit and Loss, Cash Flow Statement for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.
